- 1 All exhibits in this class must be grown in Illinois, correctly labeled and selected from the present year's crop. Clover seed and soybeans, which do not mature before the Fair, shall be selected from the preceding crop.
- 2 Root crops will be shown with two-inch tops. No waxes or oils may be used on any vegetables.
- 3 Paper plates are to be furnished by the exhibitor.
- 4 **New England Boiled Dinner Group** will consist of 1 head of cabbage and three other vegetables to be selected from carrot, turnips, onions, or potatoes. Put in cooking utensil.
- 5 **The Bushel Basket Display** will consist of a plain or decorated tipped bushel basket containing a well-balanced assortment of not less than seven or more than ten kinds of vegetables and nor more than two varieties of a kind.
- 6 **The Storage Display** will consist of six kinds of vegetables of not more than two varieties of any kind, which may be stored for winter in their natural conditions such as onions, potatoes, other root crops, pumpkins and squash (winter varieties only).
- 7 **Soup's on** using 5-10 kinds of vegetables, suitable for homemade soup. Herbs can be used but will not be counted as a vegetable.
- 8 See rules and regulations of the Bureau County Agricultural Board and Fine Arts.
